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- **Journalists may enter as many categories as they wish, although the same articles cannot be submitted for more than one category.**
  - **Only one entry consisting of three articles is allowed per category.**
  - **Each category entry must be accompanied by a completed entry form and comprise of four copies of three different articles (ORIGINAL AND THREE PHOTOCOPIES OF EACH ARTICLE) published in the twelve months to 29 July 2005. PLEASE NOTE THAT EACH SET OF THREE ARTICLES MUST HAVE A COPY OF THE ENTRY FORM AND A STATEMENT, WHERE APPLICABLE, ATTACHED. If the articles are not by-lined, confirmation of authorship (from the editor) should be attached.**
  - **All articles in each category must relate to the construction/property and architectural industries. Articles published in house journals/newsletters etc are not eligible.**
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**GROUP ENTRIES:** For any category (except Magazine of the Year) a portfolio of three articles by more than one journalist from one magazine may be submitted. Each article must be by-lined by two or more journalists and the names of at least two journalists must be common to not less than two articles, although not necessarily in the same combination.

**ARCHITECTURAL CRITIC OF THE YEAR:** This category is open to architectural critics writing in English, all over the world, and seeks to distinguish their professional role from that of the more numerous, but nevertheless important, architectural writers who observe and report upon events and issues within the world of architecture. Architectural writers and journalists are served by the **Architectural Journalist of the Year** category, however they can enter both categories provided they do not submit the same article in both categories.

**CONSTRUCTION JOURNALIST OF THE YEAR:** Entries can include any element of civil engineering and construction, including such topics as infrastructure projects, environmental issues (like waste management), transport, utilities and energy.

**NEWS REPORTER OF THE YEAR:** Entries for this category should be accompanied by an explanation of no more than two hundred words giving the background to the three articles submitted. For example, you may wish to explain that the story was an 'exclusive' or that the degree of research or teamwork required to produce the story was of particular merit.

**FEATURE WRITER OF THE YEAR:** Entries for this category should be accompanied by an explanation of no more than two hundred words outlining the (3) articles relevance to current issues in the construction/property industry. This category also allows for a series of articles (no more than three) on the same subject over two or more issues of a publication.

**HOUSING JOURNALIST OF THE YEAR:** This category seeks to recognize journalists writing about the process of all forms of housing development including policy, land, design and reconstruction.

**RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY WRITER OF THE YEAR:** This category seeks to recognize journalists writing about sales, marketing and management issues for all forms of residential property.

**YOUNG JOURNALIST OF THE YEAR:** The age limit for this category is 25 years or under with no more than two years experience in the construction/property/architectural sector to the period ending 29 July 2005 (verified by a letter from your editor).

**MAGAZINE OF THE YEAR (WEEKLY):** The Awards (both weekly and non weekly) seek to recognize the importance of editorial team effort in producing high quality publications for every sector of the construction, property and architectural industries, during the period, year ending 29 July 2005.

**MAGAZINE OF THE YEAR (NON WEEKLY):** The non weekly category specifically encourages entries from specialist publications which are published monthly, quarterly or produced 6 or 10 times, during the period, year ending 29 July 2005. In both categories the editor should prepare a statement clearly outlining why he/she believes the magazine has substantially covered the market sector during the period, year ending 29 July 2005 with investigative reporting, features and news stories. To support the above the editor should select any three issues, **(Four copies of each issue)** covering the period ending 29 July 2005 which should demonstrate use of research, choice of subject, photography, design and layout.

**IBP JOURNALIST OF THE YEAR:** This Award will be judged from the winning entries of the other nine individual categories.
